### *The School*

On September 15 2004, Aarhus School of Business (ASB) celebrated its 65th anniversary. However, ASB's predecessor, The Jutland Business School (Den Jyske Handelshøjskole, DJH), has a somewhat more extensive history. Already in the late 1800's DJH provided business programmes to young people from Jutland who wished to take an education within business, economics and trade. Only when ASB was founded in 1939 did it become the academic institution that as today.

we know

Since the founding of ASB more than 65 years ago, it has grown and kept growing. In 1968, ASB moved from the original location down town Aarhus to the yellow buildings which since then have provided the setting for the outstanding research and teaching ASB stands for.

Today ASB is an EQUIS accredited business school, with more than 7,000 students (a significant number of which are international students) and about 450 employees.

## *The City*

Aarhus has a population of 275,000 and is centrally located in Denmark and Northern Europe. The city's business development, its research and educational activities, the environment as well as the cultural and leisure activities combine with its strategic location to make Aarhus a very important economic growth area in Denmark. Aarhus has long been known as a cultural centre, offering a rich and varied selection from just about every cultural genre.



Aarhus hosts its own cultural festival every year in September and offers more than 300 events in opera, dance, theatre, classical and rock music, and street performance. Less formal, but not less important, is the local music environment which thrives in the city's many cafes, bars and restaurants; the result is a vibrant night-life. Aarhus has six historical museums and two large fine arts museums as well as smaller exhibition spaces and galleries.

Aarhus is one of Denmark's important research and education centres. Just about one tenth of the inhabitants, approximately 25,000, are enrolled in an education at university level, and about one fifth of the population is engaged in upper-secondary or tertiary education.

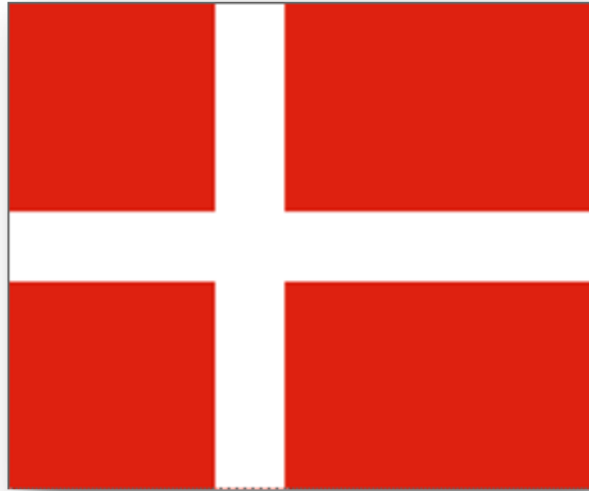
